

After a year in France went to Leeds University. Member of the University O.T.C. Services during the Great War 1914-18: commissioned in the 7th Batt. King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry, November, 1914; during a raid on the enemy's trenches was wounded and taken prisoner; now reported through the B.R.C. Society to have died on the 19th November, 1915; buried in the Beauchamp Militär-Friedhof, grave number 58.

Whittaker, Gerald (Nowell). 3rd August, 1899. Son of E. D. Whittaker, 79 Victoria Crescent, Eccles. Left July, 1916. Chartered Accountant. During the Great War 1914-18 served in the Machine Gun Corps. 79 Victoria Crescent, Eccles.

Wrigglesworth, Edgar Harold (Shute). 24th October, 1895. Son of James Wrigglesworth, Fairbank, Frizinghall, Bradford. Left July, 1912. Services during the Great War 1914-18: Lieut. in the Leicestershire Yeomanry; taken prisoner. Fairbank, Frizinghall, Bradford.

Younger, John Wenslip (Nowell). 28th June, 1897. Son of John Younger, Benton Farm, Newcastle-on-Tyne. Left July, 1912. Farming. During the Great War 1914-18 served 3 years as a Lieut. in the Northumberland Fusiliers; 2 years in France; once wounded. Benton Farm, Newcastle-on-Tyne.

Passed out of Dartmouth to Midshipman, R.N. 1st Class, 5th in order of merit, also took first Navigation Prize, May, 1917. Teluk Anson, Perak, F.M.S.

Delves, Frederick William (Town). 5th April, 1896. Son of Mrs Delves, Pendle View, Long Preston. Left

April, 1913. During the Great War 1914-18 held the rank of Lieut. in the 6th Batt. West Yorkshire Regt. Pendle View, Long Preston.

Gardner, George Dudley (Shute). 29th July, 1896. Son of G. J. E. Gardner, Alverton House, Northallerton. Left July, 1913. Services during the Great War 1914-18: commissioned in the 4th Batt. Yorkshire Regt.; transferred to R.A.F.; Lieut. No. 5 Squadron (Res.); promoted Major; awarded the M.C.; three times mentioned in despatches; Italian Silver Medal for Valour; served in Salonika; demobilised, 8th April, 1919. Alverton House, Northallerton.

*Llewellyn, Paul (Paley). 25th January, 1898. Son of John Llewellyn, The Glade, Northwood, Middlesex. Left July, 1911. The Glade, Northwood, Middlesex.

Mead, George Preston (Paley). 1st May, 1896. Son of Dr. R. W. Mead, 5 Skinner Street, Whitby. Left July, 1913. 1st XI Cricket. Chartered Accountant. A.C.A. 5 Skinner Street, Whitby, Yorks.

Prosser, James Henry (Nowell). 22nd September, 1900. Son of the late Henry Prosser, of Harrogate. Left April, 1919. 1st XI Cricket. Business: Wall Paper Merchant. Norton Grange, Knowle, near Birmingham.

Sandys, Claude Henry Congreve (Paley). 29th July, 1895. Son of Mrs Sandys, Raglan House, Brooklands, Cheshire. Left July, 1913. 1st XI Cricket. During the Great War 1914-18 served in the Inns of Court O.T.C. Raglan House, Brooklands, Cheshire.

*Scott, Charles Reginald Malcolm (Shute). 25th August, 1895. Son of J. W. Scott, Bank House, Oakham. Left December, 1912. During the Great War 1914-18 served as a 2nd-Lieut. in the R.G.A. (T.F.). *11 Saxe Coburg Street, Leicester.
