And at her death the house may be sold to the best advantage, and the profits derived therefrom to be equally divided between my surviving children.

I also appoint my wife Helen sole Executrix of this my will.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my [15] hand, this twenty eight day of May, one thousand eight hundred eighty four.
